The Pastor's Heart February 2024

We sure know how to celebrate around here. It all begins with food. In the last couple of months, I have enjoyed Thanksgiving dinner, the 140th Anniversary luncheon, a Karen Christmas potluck, the church survey soup lunch, and the all-church business meeting potluck. Really! Have you noticed in the gospels that much of Jesus' ministry centered around food? We will be sharing the Lord's Supper on this first Sunday of February, it is taken from the Passover meal and given life by the body and blood of Jesus. One of my favorite salvation stories is that in John 4 about Jesus' encounter with the woman at the well. She goes from obviously avoiding anyone she can to becoming the evangelist around town.

"My food," Jesus said, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work." John 4:34 The disciples were bewildered saying, "Has anyone brought him something to eat?" Of course not. Jesus found the spiritual food of sharing the gospel as quite appetizing. Do you feel this way when you share your faith with others? Or instead, does it bring on anxiety or nervousness? For many this is the reaction, yet I would like to share how to be satisfied like Jesus was when he shared his witness of the gospel.

Sharing our faith is the mandate for every believer. We just took a Church survey at the start of 2024 and the results indicated a weakness in our witness. In fact, it never came up as a topic. It really struck me that it was not listed as a strength or a weakness of our church. It was not mentioned. This being the case I believe we can address this topic of evangelism as the church. Jesus took his disciples to a mountain in Galilee where they worshipped him. He told them (and all believers) to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." We all have the mandate to share our faith.



The man living in the cemetery wanted to go with Jesus and his disciples, but Jesus said, "Go home to your friends and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you." Mark 5:19 We have the privilege of sharing Jesus where we live also. We can tell others what he has done for us. Like the man with a multi-year drinking problem. A critic of scripture asked him if he believed that Jesus really turned water into wine. I sure do and I also know that in my life he turned alcohol into water and furniture and a peaceful family in my home.

Last fall I went to a workshop put on by Great Commission Alliance where participants were taught the One-Minute Witness. This is what we learned: First, get permission by saying, "May I ask you a question?" If they say, "Yes," ask, "What is the best thing that has ever happened to you?" Listen to them and prove you care for them. When they are done, ask: "May I share the best thing that has ever happened to me?" If they say "Yes," continue with your One-Minute Witness.

Second, share about your life before you met Christ. Use three words or phrases to describe your life before Christ. Then share the turning point, that is, "How did you hear about Jesus?" Next share your life after your decision. This can also include three words or phrases that describe the change Christ has done in you.

Lastly, summarize what your life would look like without Christ in a concluding statement. Say something like, "If I had never met Jesus, I would probably be living just for myself." Once you share your story, ask the person you are meeting with if they would be interested in knowing Jesus? It could be as simple as, "Are you ready to trust Jesus as your Savior and Lord today?" Remember, all you do is share your story. Let the Holy Spirit take care of the conversion. Be ready to witness your faith every day.


